Be it resolved that the Regional Context Statement for Central Saanich include the following criteria for determining a "pressing public health" need:

1. *The service is required to meet community health needs, based on: water quantity and quality documentation created via studies at the wellhead, of all well water within the community where problems are reported, over the period of one year by a professional hydrogeologist, appointed by the District, and supervised by a water quality team, including members of the District, the Regional Water Commission, the CRD, and members of the public appointed to municipal water committees and the regional commission.*

 - c. *that thorough documented studies (appended to the letter) have shown the water to be untreatable.*

EXTENSION OF WATER LINES INTO RURAL OR AGRICULTURAL AREAS IS NOT SUPPORTED, EXCEPT TO ADDRESS PRESSING PUBLIC HEALTH OR ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES, OR TO PROVIDE WATER FOR AGRICULTURAL OR FIRE SUPPRESSION USES. GIVEN CONCERNS ABOUT THE LINK BETWEEN EXTENSION OF SEWER SERVICES INTO RURAL AREAS AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT, THE EXTENSION OF SANITARY SEWER SERVICES OUTSIDE THE RUCSPA WILL ONLY BE CONSIDERED IN CASES WHERE PUBLIC HEALTH OR ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES ASSOCIATED WITH SEPTIC SYSTEM FAILURES CANNOT OTHERWISE BE RESOLVED. ANY EXTENSIONS MUST BE CONSISTENT WITH CURRENTLY ADOPTED COUNCIL POLICIES FOR WATER AND SEWER LINE EXTENSION CRITERIA.

2. That the third sentence in the second paragraph under Section 12.3.1 (Managing and Balancing Growth), under the subheading "Protect the Integrity of Rural Communities", be deleted in its entirety and the following substituted therefor:

THE DISTRICT DOES NOT EXTEND URBAN SERVICES SUCH AS THE SEWER AND WATER SYSTEM INTO THE RURAL OR AGRICULTURAL AREAS, EXCEPT TO ADDRESS PRESSING PUBLIC HEALTH OR ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES OR TO PROVIDE WATER FOR AGRICULTURAL OR FIRE SUPPRESSION USES, AS STATED ABOVE.

Be it resolved that the Regional Context Statement for Central Saanich include the following "Prior Justification Procedure" requirement for implementation of solutions in response to determinations of "pressing public health" caused by water deemed "unfit for human consumption" or "hazardous" under GCDWQ guidelines.

If a determination of "pressing public health" has been made, a "prior justification procedure" will be used to determine whether solutions can be implemented locally to address the "pressing public health" problems. On-site local solutions must be implemented, under District water quality team supervision, to address problems.

Documentation must be provided by an independent Consultant hired on behalf of the District to study individual failures, and who has satisfactorily:

- a. implemented small-scale local solutions, public education and conservation initiatives, to be paid for by individual homeowners,*
- b. provided a detailed report assessing the initial nature of problems, and documentation demonstrating functioning for one year of the local solutions implemented to address problems.*

EXTENSION OF WATER LINES FOR FIRE SUPPRESSION WOULD REQUIRE INFORMATION SUFFICIENT TO SUPPORT THE EXTENSION BEING DEEMED TO BE IN THE GREATER COMMUNITY INTEREST BY COUNCIL. IN ADDITION, ALL WATER LINE EXTENSIONS MUST BE MADE IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DISTRICT'S FIRE CHIEF, TO ENSURE MAXIMUM BENEFIT OF ALL REQUESTED WATER LINE EXTENSION(S) TOWARDS RESOLVING EXTENSIVE FIRE INTERFACE RISKS.
