

District of Central Saanich Bylaw No. 2242

A BYLAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF BYLAWS BY BYLAW NOTICE

WHEREAS section 260 of the *Community Charter* authorizes the District to enforce its bylaws;

AND WHEREAS the *Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act* authorizes the District to establish a bylaw notice enforcement system;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the District of Central Saanich, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

PART 1 – Title

- 1 This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the “**BYLAW NOTICE ENFORCEMENT BYLAW NO 2242.**”

Part 2 - Definitions

- 2.1 In this Bylaw:

“Act” means the *Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act*, S.B.C. 2003, c. 60, as amended or replaced from time to time;

“Adjudicator” means a person appointed as an adjudicator under section 15 of the Act.

“Bylaw Enforcement Officer” means a person designated as such under this Bylaw.

“Bylaw Notice” or “Notice” has the same meaning as the Act, section 4

“Disputant” means a person to whom a Bylaw Notice has been issued, and who has filed a notice of dispute or otherwise requested an adjudication of that Bylaw Notice.

“District” means the Corporation of the District of Central Saanich

“Late Penalty” means a late penalty imposed under Part 4 of this Bylaw;

“Reduced Penalty” means a reduced penalty imposed under Part 4 of this Bylaw;

“Registry” means the District of Central Saanich Bylaw Notice Dispute Adjudication Registry established pursuant to Part 6 of this Bylaw.

“Regulation” means the Bylaw Notice Enforcement Regulation, B.C. Reg. 175/2004, as amended or replaced from time to time.

"Screening Officer" means a person appointed to that position under this Bylaw.

- 2.2 Unless otherwise defined in this Bylaw, words and phrases used in this Bylaw have the same meaning as in the *Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act*, the *Bylaw Notice Enforcement Regulation*, the *Community Charter*, the *Local Government Act*, and the *Motor Vehicle Act*, as applicable.
- 2.3 Where a paragraph, sentence, or graphic in this bylaw is written in italics and is preceded by the words “Information Notes”, the contents of the paragraph, sentence, or graphic are provided only to assist in the understanding of the bylaw and do not form a part of it.
- 2.4 A reference to a person designated as a Screening Officer or Bylaw Enforcement Officer by virtue of their appointed position includes a person appointed to a similar position with substantially the same duties and functions

PART 3 – Bylaw Contravention

- 3.1 Subject to the *Regulation* every bylaw contravention of every District Bylaw, including a contravention that arises under part 4 of this Bylaw, is designated as a bylaw contravention that may be dealt with by a Bylaw Notice.

- 3.2 If a bylaw contravention may be dealt with by a Bylaw Notice, a Bylaw Enforcement Officer may complete and issue a Bylaw Notice to a person against whom the contravention is alleged.

Information Note: See section 16 of the Community Charter for bylaw enforcement officer authority to enter on or into a property

PART 4 - Offence and Penalty

- 4.1 A person who contravenes a bylaw designated in this Bylaw is liable to the penalties established in Schedule "A" of this Bylaw and this Part.
- 4.2 Unless a specific penalty is established in Schedule "A" for a designated contravention, the penalty for a contravention is:
- a. \$200 if the penalty is received by the Registry within 14 days of the person receiving, or being presumed to have received, the Bylaw Notice under section 4 of the Act;
 - b. \$300 if the penalty is received by the Registry between 15 and 28 days of the person receiving, or being presumed to have received, the Bylaw Notice under section 4 of the Act;
 - c. \$400 if the penalty is paid more than 28 days after the person received, or is presumed to have received, the Bylaw Notice under section 4 of the Act;
- 4.3 Subject to Part 3 and 4, the penalty for a contravention referred to in Section 3.1 this Bylaw is as follows:
- a. If received by the Registry within 14 days of the person receiving or being presumed to have received the Bylaw Notice under section 4 of the Act, the Reduced Penalty set out in column A1 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this Bylaw.
 - b. If received by the Registry between 15 and 28 days of the person receiving or being presumed to have received the Bylaw Notice under the Act, the Regular Penalty amount is set out in column A2 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this Bylaw.
 - c. If paid more than 28 days after the person received or is presumed to have received the Bylaw Notice under the Act, the Late Penalty amount is set out in column A3 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this Bylaw.

Information Note: *Delivery of the Bylaw Offence Notice and date presumed to have been received as per section 7the Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act. If mailed, assumed received by the 7th day after mailing; if in person, or left on a vehicle, it is on that day.*

PART 5 - Period for Paying or Disputing Notice

- 5.1 A person who receives a Bylaw Notice must:
- a. pay the penalty, or
 - b. request dispute adjudication within 14 days of the date on which the person received or is presumed to have received the Bylaw Notice under the Act by filling in the appropriate dispute form and delivering it, either in person during regular office hours, by mail, to the District of Central Saanich's Municipal Hall, 1903 Mt Newton Cross Road, Saanichton BC V8M 2A9 or email at bylaw@csaanich.ca.
- 5.2 A person may pay the indicated regular penalty later than 14 days after receiving the Bylaw Notice in accordance with Section 4.4 (b), but the Bylaw Notice may no longer be disputed after 14 days of receipt.
- 5.3 If payment is made after 28 days of receiving the Bylaw Notice, a surcharge for late payment will apply, in accordance with Section 4.4 (c).
- 5.4 If a Bylaw Notice was not delivered in person, and person advises the District, in accordance with the requirements of Section 25 of the Act, that they did not receive a copy of the original Bylaw Notice, the time limits for responding to a Bylaw Notice under Sections 4 of this Bylaw do not begin to run until a copy of the Bylaw Notice is delivered to them in accordance with the Act.

PART 6 - Bylaw Notice Dispute Adjudication

- 6.1 The Registry, located at District of Central Saanich's Municipal Hall, 1903 Mt Newton Cross Road, Saanichton BC V8M 2A9, is established as a Bylaw Notice dispute adjudication system in accordance with the Act to resolve disputes in relation to Bylaw Notices.

- 6.2 Every person who is unsuccessful in a dispute adjudication in relation to a Bylaw Notice under the dispute adjudication system established under this section must pay the District an additional fee of \$25 for the purpose of the District recovering partial costs of administration of the bylaw notice dispute adjudication system.

Information Note: An adjudicator for a dispute must be selected in accordance with section 15 [dispute adjudicators] of the Act, appointed by the provincial Attorney, and adjudication hearing will be scheduled in person, via telephone or by written submission. The decision is final and binding.

PART 7 - Screening Officers

- 7.1 The position of Screening Officer is hereby established.
- 7.2 Persons acting in or hired to the following positions or titles, may act as Screening Officers:
- a. Director of Planning and Building Services, or delegate;
 - b. Manager of Building, Bylaw, and Business Services;
 - c. Manager of Planning;
 - d. Director of Engineering, or delegate;
 - e. Fire Chief, or delegate.
- 7.3 For the purposes of the Central Saanich Animal Control Bylaw, persons designated by the Capital Regional District Animal Control Services may act as Screening Officers

PART 8 - Powers, Duties and Functions of Screening Officers

- 8.1 A Bylaw Notice issued to enforce a bylaw must be reviewed by a Screening Officer before a dispute adjudication in respect of the Bylaw Notice may be scheduled.
- 8.2 The powers, duties and functions of Screening Officers are set out in the Act and include the following:
- a. Where requested by the person against whom a contravention is alleged, communicate information respecting the nature of the contravention, the provision of the bylaw contravened, the facts on which the contravention

allegation is based, the penalty for a contravention, the opportunity to enter into a compliance agreement, the opportunity to proceed to the bylaw notice dispute adjudication system, and the fee or fees payable in relation to the bylaw notice dispute adjudication system;

- b. Communicate with any or all of the following for the purpose of performing their functions under this Bylaw or the Act:
 - i. the person against whom a contravention is alleged or their representative;
 - ii. the officer issuing the Bylaw Notice;
 - iii. the complainant or their representative;
 - iv. the District's staff, including a review of the District's records, regarding the disputant's history of bylaw compliance.

8.3 A Screening Officer, after reviewing a Bylaw Notice, may:

- a. cancel the notice in accordance with the Act,
- b. confirm the Bylaw Notice and refer it to an adjudicator unless the request for dispute adjudication is withdrawn, or
- c. enter into a compliance agreement in accordance with Part 9.

PART 9 – Compliance Agreements

9.1 A Screening Officer may enter into a compliance agreement with a person who has received a Bylaw Notice in respect of any bylaw contravention if the Screening Officer considers that:

- a. the person has contravened a provision of a bylaw as indicated on the Bylaw Notice,
- b. the health or safety of any person or property is not at immediate risk as a result of the bylaw contravention, and
- c. entering into the compliance agreement is appropriate in the circumstances.

Information Note: Refer to Central Saanich Council Policy on Bylaw Offence Notices for more details on Compliance Agreements

9.2 A compliance agreement must:

- a. be in writing,
- b. describe one or more actions the person named in the Bylaw Notice agrees to take or refrain from taking, which may include expenditures the person agrees to make, to remedy the person's contravention or the adverse effects that resulted from the contravention,
- c. subject to section 9.3, set out the time frame within which the person named in the Bylaw Notice agrees to take or not take each action described in paragraph (b) and report to the Screening Officer on the action taken or not taken, and
- d. subject to section 9.3, specify the date the agreement ends.

9.3 The maximum duration of a compliance agreement entered into under this part is 1 year.

9.4 Subject to section 9.5, the penalty payable for a bylaw contravention dealt with by Bylaw Notice may be reduced by an amount up to 100% in accordance with a compliance agreement entered into under this section.

9.5 If, in the opinion of the Screening Officer, the person who has entered into a compliance agreement breaches a term of the compliance agreement or otherwise fails to observe or perform the terms of the compliance agreement, the Screening Officer may rescind the compliance agreement and apply the full penalty.

PART 10 - Bylaw Enforcement Officers

10.1 Persons acting as any of the following are hereby designated as bylaw enforcement officers for the purposes of this Bylaw and the Act:

- a. Members of the Central Saanich Police Services; and
- b. Bylaw Enforcement Officers, Building Officials, Animal Control Officers, Fire Inspectors or other persons acting in another capacity on behalf of the District for the purpose of enforcement of one or more of its bylaws.

Information Note: See section 3 [bylaw enforcement officer] of the Community Charter Bylaw Enforcement Ticket Regulations for specific classes of persons designated.


PART 11 – Form of Documents

- 11.1 The District may from time to time establish the form or forms of the Bylaw Notice (provided it complies with Section 4 of the Act), dispute form, compliance agreement or other related documents.
- 11.2 Bylaw notice, dispute forms, compliance agreement or other related documents may be completed, issued and stored in electronic format by electronic means that allows the documents to be reproduced in intelligible form.

PART 12 - Severability

- 12.1 If any portion of this Bylaw is held to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, then the invalid portion must be severed and the remainder of this Bylaw is deemed to have been adopted with the severed section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or phrase, and such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw.
